





'Monty' would have been proud of Binsted's D-Day 80 service

Generations came together to commemorate D-Day 80 in the East Hampshire village where a giant of the campaign was laid to rest.

A group of Binsted Primary School pupils visited the village grave of Field Marshal Montgomery, 1st Viscount of El Alamein, before a special midday D-Day service in Holy Cross Church last Thursday.

The youngsters were accompanied by a veteran who was immensely impressed with their knowledge of arguably Britain's most successful World War Two commander.

The man who commanded all ground forces at the D-Day landings on June 6, 1944, would have been touched by the proceedings with exactly 100 villagers gathering in the church for a service led by Red Matt Boyes.

Bells were rung, the church was bedecked with flowers and pupils dressed in 1940s attire for the service, which included a reading by a veteran and three hymns, respectively for the Royal Navy, Army and Royal Air Force.



The National Anthem was sung and a recording of Dame Vera Lynn's We'll Meet Again was aired. The youngsters in the pews swayed to the music, while there was hardly a dry eye among the more mature.

Binsted Holy Cross is immensely honoured to be the custodian of Monty's grave and his recently refurbished banner hangs in the church.

His grave – looking suitably smart and adorned with several

poignant tributes from locals and those from further afield – attracts visitors throughout the year with tributes arriving from afar as China and Russia.

The service was a poignant commemoration not only of Monty, but also to all the men and women who were committed to the largest seaborne invasion in history.

The start of the liberation of occupied Europe, and the beginning of the end of World War Two, was thanks to their heroism and actions. We will remember them.




Maintaining Binsted's Rights of Way

It certainly has been a very wet Winter and Spring, meaning that even in June, many of our footpaths and bridleways are still very waterlogged and muddy. Any new downpour often renders footpaths very tricky to navigate, because the water table seems to be so high. This, in combination with the welcome arrival of some warm sunny days, means only one thing – the need for some vigorous "vegetation management" on Binsted's Rights of Way! Man-eating patches of nettles and brambles have already been spotted. Fortunately, our team of volunteers is well equipped with both manual and electric tools, supplied by County and Parish councils, to help us

do this. If you encounter any problem areas, don't hesitate to report it, using the methods at the foot of this piece. We will do our best.

In previous years, some of the priority paths in the Parish have had vegetation cut back by contractors working for the County Council. It has now been announced that this will no longer continue, due to escalating costs. Although HCC will be trying to allocate additional resources to this task from within the Countryside Services team, it will inevitably mean that significant parts of this annual task will fall to the County's teams of volunteers to cope with, supported by the Community Engagement Rangers, of course.

Finally, on a much lighter note, I was perturbed in May that I still had not heard a cuckoo. In previous years, the cuckoo was the soundtrack to walks on many of my local footpaths, that distinctive call often heard faintly in the distance. In May, it was missing and sorely missed. Then suddenly, at the end of the month, the sound was all around, in three or four different places. And one day, quite unlike anything before, I had a cuckoo calling in the tree directly above my head - that is one loud bird. Welcome back!

The Binsted volunteers are regularly inspecting the parish's paths, but if you would like to report a problem on any of the Binsted Rights of Way, whether it is a fallen tree, a broken stile, a collapsed fingerpost or simply some overgrown vegetation, you can do so online on the Hampshire "Report a problem on a right of way" page – this requires you to create an account and log in to the site first. Alternatively, you can use the volunteer team's own email address to do so – it is BinstedRoW@gmail. com. One final way of reporting a Rights of Way problem is to do so on the Binsted Community Facebook group. The volunteer team will try to identify problems reported there and deal with them promptly if we can - in all cases, please give as much location information as possible.

At St Mary's Bentley



I recently visited the National Trust gardens at Stourhead, in Wiltshire. I read that, the original planting of the garden, in the eighteenth century was undertaken by a team of 50 gardeners, who planted and tended beech, oak, sycamore, Spanish chestnut, ash and holm oak. It's well worth a visit, as many of the original trees are now in their prime. But there are no ash now.

In that same 18th century William Gilpin wrote:

I have sometimes heard the Oak called the Hercules of the forest; and the Ash, the Venus.

I have no argument with that. Just look at what we have at the left rear of Binsted Recreation Ground. Massive and majestic, a true Venus

So where have the Stourhead ash all gone?

The main threat to ash trees is ash dieback, also known as Chalara dieback. This is a disease caused by a fungus called Hymenoscyphus fraxineus (previously Chalara fraxinea). Ash dieback causes trees to lose their leaves and the crown to die back, and usually results in their death. It is thought that tens of thousands of ash trees will die, potentially changing the UK landscape forever.

When fully grown, ash trees can reach a height of 35m. Tall and graceful, they often grow together, forming a domed canopy. The bark is pale brown to grey and fissures as the tree ages. The tree is easily identified in winter by its smooth twigs that have distinctive black, velvety leaf buds arranged opposite each other. The leaves typically comprise 3-6 opposite pairs of light green. oval leaflets with tips up to 40cm long. There is an additional singular 'terminal' leaflet at the end. The leaves can move in the direction of sunlight, and sometimes the whole crown of the tree may lean in the direction of the sun. Another characteristic of ash leaves is that they fall when they are still green.

Ash is dioecious, meaning that male and female flowers typically grow on different trees, although a single tree can also have male and female flowers on different branches. Both male and female flowers are purple and appear before the leaves in spring, growing in spiked clusters at the tips of twigs.

Once the female flowers have been pollinated by wind, they develop into conspicuous winged fruits, or 'keys', in late summer and autumn. They fall from the tree in winter and early spring, and are dispersed by birds and mammals.

Ash trees make the perfect habitat for a number of different species of wildlife. The airy canopy and early leaf fall allow sunlight to reach the woodland floor. providing optimum conditions for wild flowers. In turn, these support a range of insects such as the rare and threatened high brown fritillary butterfly.

Bullfinches eat the seeds and woodpeckers, owls, redstarts and nuthatches use the trees for nesting. Because the trees are so long lived, they support deadwood specialists such as the lesser stag beetle. Ash is regularly accompanied by a hazel understorey, providing the ideal conditions for dormice. Ash bark is often covered with lichens and mosses. The leaves are an important food plant for the caterpillars of many species of moth, including the coronet. brick, centre-barred sallow and privet hawk-moth

People have worked with ash timber for years. It is one of the toughest hardwoods and absorbs shocks without splintering. It is the wood of choice for making tools and sport handles, including hammers, axes, spades, hockey sticks and oars. An attractive wood, it is also prized for furniture.

The young, green, immature seeds of ash are edible and have also been used in herbal medicine. Ash trees are in the olive family (Oleaceae) and produce oil that is chemically similar to olive oil.

Ash trees can live to a grand old age of 400 years – even longer if coppiced, the stems traditionally providing wood for firewood and charcoal. We cannot, we must not lose them.






